The girls listened intently and engaged well in our devotional times, as well as joining in with the usual array of games and crafts. Please pray with us for the young ladies in our care as we seek to not only teach them about Jesus, but also inspire them to get to know Him for themselves.

As always, we couldn't manage without our dedicated group of leaders, who work really well together. This has been a particularly difficult and uncertain season, and at times our plans have changed at short notice. We thank God that although these changes weren't part of our plan, they were part of His. We are also thrilled to have a number of new leaders join us this year; girls who attend brownies themselves and who have grown to love and serve Jesus as their Saviour. It's a real delight to watch them engage with the next generation of young people and share the joy of their salvation as they serve week by week.

As you pray for us, remember that our young people are growing up in a very uncertain world. Pray that they will put their trust in the One who holds the future and who guides us with His hands.
